This is in continuation of the visit of the UGC Visiting Committee to consider the XI Plan General Development Grant Allocation to your University.

2. Based on the Report submitted by the XI Plan UGC Visiting Committee and availability of funds from the Government of India, UGC has approved the tentative XI Plan Allocation, subject to availability of funds from Government of India, in respect of your University as under:

(Rs. in Lakhs)	
i) General Development Grant	926.25
ii) Merged Schemes	544.00
iii) Internal Quality assurance cell	5.00

3. The 'on account' grant already under the above schemes released by UGC during XI Plan Period will be a part of XI Plan Allocation of the university. Further, funds for Merged Schemes is based on the eligibility criteria indicated in the XI Plan Guidelines. Therefore, the grant for each of the merged scheme will be released subject to the fulfillment of the eligibility criteria and other related norms as laid down for the purpose.
4. A new scheme called Internal Quality Assurance Cell has also been included in the merged schemes and an additional amount of Rs.5.00 lakhs has been allocated to each State University. The Guidelines of this Scheme may be seen on UGC website www.ugc.ac.in
5. The XI Plan Allocation is subject to compliance of the Academic Reforms as already circulated by the UGC vide its D.O.No.F 1-2/2008 (XI Plan) dated 30th March/21st April, 2009 which is also available on UGC website www.ugc.ac.in.
6. In addition to above, the following Administrative Reforms may also be implemented:
- Implementation of the Govt. of India Reservation Policy of SC/ST.
 - All Statutory posts should be filled up the appointment through Selection Committee as per the UGC Regulations.
 - All vacant Teaching Posts should be filled up expeditiously.
 - Annual Accounts, Annual Reports and Quality assessment Status Report should be submitted in time i.e. by 31st December of every year.
7. The release of grant will also be linked to Academic and Administrative Reforms as well as compliance of various policies of Government of India rules.
8. You are also requested to utilize proportionate grant on half yearly basis. Any portion which remain unutilized will be considered to be lapsed. UGC will also consider to

allocate the unutilized grant of the university to other universities which are better performing and are also following the various academic reforms as well as implementation of various policies of Government of India. Therefore, the University is advised to utilize the grant fully.

9. The amount recommended by the Visiting Committee for various merged schemes may be utilized as per guidelines of respective schemes available on UGC website. The anomaly if any as per pattern of assistance/guidelines may be brought to the notice of the Commission.
10. You are, therefore requested to re-work the priorities of university within the General Development Grant allocation as decided by the Commission and keeping in view the recommendation of the Visiting Committee. The revised proposal (item-wise and year-wise plan) in the prescribed format UGC (copy enclosed) may be sent within 15 days in duplicate along with the soft copy within the ceiling conveyed to University. After receipt of the item-wise allocation within the amount as decided by the Committee, the UGC will convey the final approval of XI Plan Allocation to the University.
11. A copy of the Report of the Visiting Committee is enclosed herewith for further necessary action at the University level.

Overall Observations:

Acharya Nagarjuna University was established in the year 1976, on about 300 acres of rural land. It caters mainly to the higher education needs of three coastal Districts namely Krishna, Guntur and Prakasam of Andhra Pradesh. It also draws students from other regions of Andhra Pradesh.

The University has 475 Affiliated Colleges. It has 9 Faculties, 37 Postgraduate Departments and 7 Centers. Two Post Graduate Centers have been established at Nuzvid and Ongole for Krishna and Prakasam Districts respectively. The University has 1.5 lakh students and examinations are conducted on time and admissions are held on schedule. The University has 159 faculty members and 521 supporting staff. University is also utilizing the services of contract faculty members as per requirements.

The University has put forward a proposal to establish the "University College of Engineering and Technology". Initially five B.Tech. Programme in Computer Science and Engineering, Information Technology, Electronics and Communication Engineering, Electrical and Electronics Engineering and Civil Engineering are proposed to be introduced. This proposal was approved in the Executive Council Meeting of the University on

13-08-2008. Keeping in view the requirements of the technical manpower in this rural area, the committee recommends the proposal to establish the College of Engineering & Technology. It will go a long way in providing opportunities to the meritorious and economically backward students from this rural area to acquire quality technical education at less cost compared to private engineering colleges. The committee also felt that some existing departments like Computer Science and Engineering, and Physics, Electronics & Instrumentation Technology will be of great help in running B.Tech. programme in the above- mentioned areas at the initial stage. All the above departments may form nucleus for the proposed University College of Engineering and Technology. While approving the proposal, the committee recommends a sum of Rs.233 lakhs as a seed grant from UGC and advise the University to approach the State Government and other agencies for necessary financial assistance.

Based on the visit to various Departments, the Committee has made certain recommendations. The detailed comments with regard to Departments are given in **Annexure-I**.

Specific Observations:

The Committee observed during its visit to various Departments that many departments are running the programmes on self-financing mode. This was taken up with the Vice-Chancellor, Rector and Registrar who informed the Committee that "the salaries and the contingencies expenditure is met from Block grant received from State Governments". Hence, Registrar had requested the Committee in his letter dated 17.09.2008 (original letter enclosed) that the words "self-financing" used in the Report submitted to the Committee may be ignored and all the departments in the University may be treated as aided departments". Accordingly, the grants have been allocated for all the departments.

While allocating the grants for a few departments, the Committee has recommended a few teaching staff. Since only three years are left for the XI Plan to be completed, the allocation of grants has been made for only balance period of three years.

The University has given a Certificate to the effect that it is physically located in Nagarjuna Nagar, Namburu Village, Pedakakani Mandal, Guntur Dist., which is a rural area issued by the District Revenue Officer, Collector's Office: Guntur dated

18.09.2008 is **enclosed** herewith. Accordingly a Committee has allocated the eligible grant to the University under Merged Scheme.

The Committee observed that the University is running a number of Management related programmes as separate Departments. The Committee strongly feels that the University should go for a School of Business Studies and put all of them as separate courses. Similarly, in Science, Bio-Chemistry P.G.Programme could be put under Chemistry Department. There is need to bring courses with similarity in Humanities and Social Sciences under one umbrella wherever possible.

The Committee recommends Library Building at ANU PG Campus, Nezvid.

Further, the Committee recommends a Central Academic Building for all the Departments of PG Campus on Ongole.

The Committee recommends one Boy's hostel and one Girl's hostel in the main campus in view of the existing inadequate facilities. The Girl's Hostel is a part of the Merged Schemes.

The Committee puts on record its appreciation for the hospitality extended to its members during the visits.


