The BOS resolved to offer 04 groups of Soft Core papers (CBCS) instead of the existing 05 groups. In view of the untimely demise of the Dr. M.V. Vasu, Professor of History, Bangalore University it was resolved to discontinue 02 Soft Core papers (CBCS) -Urbanization in India to 1600 AD and Oral History;

The BOS restructured the CBCS Course Matrix (Four Semesters) of MA History and approved the same. It was also resolved that the restructured Matrix will come into effect from the academic year **2015-16**.
