## An Introduction for Transfer Students

SMU welcomes transfer students! Transfers comprise a large and important component of the total student body and their diverse academic backgrounds enrich the educational experience for all students. SMU is particularly fortunate to enroll a significant number of students who have begun their studies at the Dallas County Community College District.

If you are considering a move to SMU, we want your transition to be seamless. SMU's Division of Enrollment Services compiles this transfer equivalency information to assist prospective students from DCCCD in planning programs of study compatible with degree requirements at SMU. Careful review of these equivalencies should facilitate transfer to the University and minimize the likelihood of loss of credits in the process.

The DCCCD Equivalency Guide can be found at <u>smu.edu/transfer/</u> <u>creditguide.asp</u>. All courses listed are considered comparable to SMU courses and thus are transferable to SMU. Transfer courses are counted in the Transfer GPA. Grades below Care used in this GPA calculation, but credit hours are not awarded.

#### An SMU Degree

An SMU degree is typically comprised of three parts: courses in your major, courses required for the General Education Curriculum and elective courses. These electives may also be used to add a second major or minor. By carefully using the DCCCD Equivalency Guide when choosing courses, all of your work should transfer to SMU and fall into one of these three categories.

#### The General Education Curriculum

SMU's General Education Curriculum (GEC) is required of all undergraduate students seeking a baccalaureate degree. DCCCD transfer students may apply approved transfer courses toward fulfillment of most of the requirements of the GEC. Other requirements must be met in residence at the University. The GEC requires a total of 41 term hours divided into 5 separate areas: FUNDAMENTALS, SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY, PERSPECTIVES, CULTURAL FORMATIONS, and WELLNESS.

Listed on the back are DCCCD courses which will apply in transfer toward GEC requirements, together with their SMU equivalencies (shown in parentheses). Transferable DCCCD courses for which there is no exact SMU equivalent are given an "XX" (or other 2-letter) designation. SMU equivalencies designated by a double asterisk (\*\*) are not included on the official GEC list of approved courses but will be acceptable in transfer to count toward fulfillment of the specified requirements.

#### **GEC** Policies

Please keep in mind the following policies and information about the GEC when planning your program of study at DCCCD:

• The CULTURAL FORMATIONS requirement must be met at SMU. However, students who enter SMU with 42 or more transferable hours are exempt from any 6 hours from the combination of CULTURAL FORMATIONS and PERSPECTIVES.

 Transfer students who don't complete the Written English and/or Mathematical Sciences components of the GEC at the time of transfer to SMU must enroll for any remaining requirements each semester until completion of these classes. Transfer students with 15 or more transferable hours from other institutions must complete these requirements by the time they finish 30 hours in residence at SMU. Those who fail to do so will be subject to suspension. For more information, see the "Policies and Procedures" section of SMU's Undergraduate Catalog.

• Students who have not completed either a two-year sequence of a single foreign language in high school or a one-year sequence of a single foreign language at the college level will be required to take two terms of a single foreign language at an accredited institution to begin no later than their third regular term after matriculation at SMU, regardless of intended major.
