



The adult is at one and the same time far superior to the child and very near to him. He dominates everything, but at the same time penetrates into the intimacy of every wish and every thought. So that the child fluctuates between question and request (or prayer) and soliloquy accompanied by a feeling of communion. Sometimes – and this is the last case mentioned – he reacts towards him as a glorified omnipresent *alter ego*. All that the child does he shares with his mother and, from his point of view, there is no frontier separating his ego from her superior ego. In such a case the child's ego-centric speech is greater with the adult than with other children. Sometimes on the contrary – and this is the first case mentioned – the child speaks to his parents as to all powerful wills or as to superior intellects. The child's thought is then able to distinguish between himself and another and becomes socialized, but the relationship thus created is one of inferior to superior, and the spiritual authority of the adult presses with all its weight on the thought of the child.

The playfellow, on the other hand, both resembles and is very different from the child's ego. He is like him because he is his equal in what he can do and in what he knows. But he is very different just because, being on the same level with him, he cannot enter into his most intimate desires or personal point of view as a friendly adult would. The child thus becomes socialized with his contemporaries in quite another way than as with the adult. He fluctuates between two poles: the monologue—individual or collective—and discussion or genuine exchange of ideas, and that is why the child's socialization with his fellows is greater than, or at least different to, his socialization with the adult alone. Where the superiority of the adult prevents discussion and co-operation, the playfellow provides the opportunity for such social conduct as will determine the true socialization of the intelligence. Conversely, where equality between playmates prevents questions and interrogation, the adult is there to supply an answer.

THE MODERN WORLD has been shaped by its metaphysics, which has shaped its education, which in turn has brought forth its science and technology. So, without going back to metaphysics and education, we can say that the modern world has been shaped by technology. It tumbles from crisis to crisis; on all sides there are prophecies of disaster and, indeed, visible signs of breakdown. If that which has been shaped by technology, and continues to be so shaped, looks sick, it might be wise to have a look at technology itself. If technology is felt to be becoming more and more inhuman, we might do well to consider whether it is possible to have something better-a technology with a human face.

Strange to say, technology, although of course the product of man, tends to develop by its own laws and principles, and these are very different from those of human nature or of living nature in general. Nature always, so to speak, knows where and when to stop. Greater even than the mystery of natural growth is the mystery of natural cessation of growth. There is measure in all

natural things – in their size, speed, or violence. As a result, the system of nature, of which man is a part, tends to be self-balancing, self-adjusting, self-cleansing. Not so with technology, or perhaps I should say: not so with man dominated by technology and specialisation. Technology recognises no self-limiting principle – in terms, for instance, of size, speed or violence. It therefore does not possess the virtues of being self-balancing, self-adjusting, and self-cleansing. In the subtle system of nature, technology, and in particular the super-technology of the modern world, acts like a foreign body, and there are now numerous signs of rejection.

Suddenly, if not altogether surprisingly, the modern world, shaped by modern technology, finds itself involved in three crises simultaneously. First, human nature revolts against inhuman technological, organisational, and political patterns, which it experiences as suffocating and debilitating; second the living environment which supports human life aches and groans and gives signs of partial breakdown; and, third, it is clear to anyone fully knowledgeable in the subject matter that the inroads being made into the world's non-renewable resources, particularly those of fossil fuels, are such that serious bottlenecks and virtual exhaustion loom ahead in the quite foreseeable future.
